In this edition we look at weed management and our new CMCA caravan park

Weed management is something I will continue to remind you about.

Following a suggestion by our Park Custodian at Temora, David Coats (NSW S121848), we have prepared a simple weeds guide for custodians. This identifies several weeds that have burrs which can cause significant damage or injury to humans and their pets.

This is available as a resource document on the website under Custodian Information. A printed version will also be provided to each park to add to the Custodian Folder.

Below is an extract from the weeds guide showing a number of common weeds that you will find across Australia.

These weeds are significant problems at our parks and if left unchecked will create a situation where guests will not want to stay.

Several custodians have requested we engage contractors to manage weeds within our parks, however when weeds are first discovered action should be taken to remove them from the grounds rather than wait until they become serious. We provide spray equipment at each park, if you are not confident in using this equipment, please advise NHQ so that we can come up with an alternative solution. If there is no spray equipment or chemicals, please let us know.

Spraying of the appropriate chemical when weeds are young is the best measure, but physical removal of plants may be needed once burrs are present on the plants.

This is an ongoing project at our parks because seed remains viable in the soil for many years and guests will also bring new seeds into the parks with them.

Rule No 1 - don't leave the problem for the next custodians to sort out!

Rule No 2 - the earlier you do something about it the easier and cheaper it will be.

CMCA Leisure and Caravan Park Nyngan NSW

CMCA is now the proud manager of the Nyngan Leisure and Van Park located at 8-10 Old Warren Road Nyngan. Nyngan is on the Mitchell Highway, 3 hours west of Dubbo and 6 hours from Broken Hill.

This small caravan park offers powered and unpowered sites as well as the normal CMCA self-contained sites. The park includes showers, toilets, barbecues and we are in the process of installing a dump point for park guests and CMCA members.

CMCA members will receive a discount on all site types in the caravan park, and if you are staying in the self-contained camping area you can access the park amenities for an extra \$3.00 per site per night.

The caravan park was about to close, so CMCA offered to manage it. Volunteer custodians will be required to manage the caravan park as per our other RV Parks, and you can book through the calendar as normal or contact NHQ. We provide a powered site for the Custodian, and the park includes an office and reception area, equipment for park maintenance and good storage areas. The amenities are tidy and include coin-operated washer and dryer as well as some basic kitchen equipment.

The owner's cleaning contractor undertakes their duties during weekdays, so the custodians will be asked to keep an eye on the amenities over weekends and public holidays and keep the office space clean and tidy. A ride-on mower and other small equipment is provided for the custodians to maintain the grounds. An office and storeroom is provided for the custodians' use, and the park has a dedicated phone number for bookings.
